## **NHS Pharmacy First Service**

We have been asked to share this information:

Did you know that the NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment? Accessing the service may mean that we can help children feel better and get back to school as quickly as possible, as well as supporting parents/carers to also get better if they are unwell with one of the conditions covered under the service.

There is usually no need to make an appointment; parents or carers can pop into their local pharmacy with their child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

Common condition	Patient eligibility
Earache	I to I7 years
Impetigo	I year and over
Infected insect bites and stings	I year and over
Sore throats	5 years and over
Sinusitis	12 years and over
Uncomplicated urinary tract	Women 16 to 64 years
Shingles	18 years and over

## Fiddle Toys in school

We have noticed that some children are bringing fiddle toys and chew toys into school. Please may we ask that your child does not do this. If you feel your child would benefit from one, please talk to your child's class teacher in the first instance, and if we agree one is needed, we will be happy to provide one. Thank you for our co-operation with this.

# **Communication with teachers**

Unlike many local schools, rather than all correspondence going via the school office, we are happy to share our teachers' email addresses directly with you. When emailing teachers, pleased be mindful of teachers' work life balance and well-being by not expecting a response to any email late in the evening. Please also be mindful that as teachers are in the classroom with children from 8.40am, they cannot guarantee to see important messages about collection arrangements etc., or see urgent emails that need an immediate action. Please ensure these are emailed to the office. I would also ask that all emails are written in a courteous manner. Unless there is an agreement between you and your child's teacher, if you are finding you need to email them on a regular basis, it may be a good idea to organise a meeting after school when you can discuss any problems face to face, Again, thank you for your co-operation with this.
